## Membership:

#### Staff

## Adjuncts

- Raffle sales have remained strong in February.
- Darts and 8 Ball on Sunday's have restarted.

#### Maintenance

- Replacement Bark required for playground should now be put on hold until next summer.
- Pothole is getting larger at the front entrance to the club.
- A skip is to be placed in the carpark this Thursday with some volunteers required to remove some of the noxious weeds and plants we have ie privet

- Report re Extraction unit. Joe has determined there is little we can do regarding our extraction Unit, moving the fan could result in a fire risk.
- It is not handling the workload and requires constant maintenance and cleaning.

#### Kitchen

- The Kitchen has had some big meal nights in February and has had some very positive reports
- New Members have been returning from signing up during the day and having evening meals.
- The Kitchen is now closed on Monday and Tuesday evenings.
- The new labelling and Food act laws have been implemented
- The heat is still a concern in the kitchen which may have had a direct effect on the increase of illness in the Kitchen staff in Feb

#### Market Stall

- The Bric a brac ladies wont to stay over the winter, and would like to know if they can re-negotiate a winter rate. Otherwise they will remain until the end of March.
- Car Boot Market for Sat March 30<sup>th</sup> currently has 10 stall holders booked

#### Entertainment

- Unfortunately, Muroki has cancelled his gig in March due to the cost to perform here.
- James Ray has been well attended in Feb.
- Film Festival event has been lost as to expensive to be at the club.

#### Stocktake

- Variance report and Valuation report.
- Major Variance on Export Quarts, this is solely due to staff error.
- Staff pushing the correct buttons has improved
- Losses for wine specifically red wines are due to the product not lasting very long in the heat and humidity.

- Tap beer is still accurate and in some cases up slightly. We may be over estimating the waste due to mispours.
- RTD'S and pack beer products accurate.

## Health and Safety

- Several burns and cuts in the kitchen.
- Pothole in the entrance. Requires repair Trip hazard.
- Trip hazard from the gaming room to the smoking deck is repaired.
- First Aid kit installed in the kitchen very low use this month.
- I looked closely at our chemical storage and have removed any old or unidentifiable chemicals. The remaining chemicals have a low risk of contaminating any food products or water ways. We do not need at this stage to provide a cage or separate storage area.
- Joe has looked at and measured up a cage for our gas storage.

### Opening from 10am

- We have been open from 10am since the 9<sup>th of</sup> January.
- We have had fantastic feed back and have signed up 50 new members in 3 weeks. The majority of whom are Raglan Locals
